In March 2004, John Kerry and John Edwards helped block legislation in Congress that would have put an end to these groundless lawsuits. In fact, Kerry took a break from his presidential campaign just so he could make a special trip to Washington to vote against this bi-partisan, common sense bill. It was the first time Kerry voted in the Senate all year, and one of only 10% of all Senate votes he's bothered to show up for at all since he launched his campaign for the White House. That says a lot about John Kerry's priorities...and a lot about where he really stands on firearms issues.
